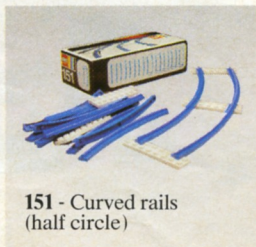
LEGO trains are the only powered trains you can build yourself. There are building plans in the sets of course though you may wish to alter the design to suit your own ideas.
