**Proclamation by the Governor.**

The Chair laid before the Senate the following proclamation by the Governor:

Proclamation

by the

Governor of the State of Texas

To all to Whom These Presents Shall Come:

Whereas, Necessity exists for legislative action on the following subjects:

1. Regulation of public utilities;
2. Taxation and revenue;
3. Public education;
4. Revenue for the support of the Highway Department;
5. Appropriations for the support of the Departments and Institutions for the ensuing biennium;
6. Priority rights in public waters;
7. Laws dealing with formation of companies for the sale of stock and shares therein, and with the sale of stock, shares and securities;
8. Amendments to the statutes prescribing judicial procedure obtaining in this State:

Now, Therefore, I, Dan Moody, Governor of the State of Texas, do, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution of this State, hereby call a Special Session of the Forty-first Legislature to be convened in the city of Austin, commencing at twelve o'clock, noon, on Monday, the third day of June, A. D. 1929, for the purpose of taking legislative action upon the above named subjects.

In testimony whereof I hereunto sign my name and cause to be impressed hereon the seal of the State of Texas at Austin, this the 30th day of May, A. D. 1929.
